What is Taith?

Taith is an assessment and specialist intervention service for Children and Young People (CYP) aged five to 21 years with harmful or problematic sexual behaviour.

Our aims are to enable children to control their harmful sexual behaviours, reduce their risk to others and help them develop safe and healthy relationships.

Taith is an established and successful service that started in Wales in 2010. We have worked with over 1,000 CYP referred to date and achieved significant improvements across several measures.

A specialist approach

Our specialist practitioners use a trauma-informed, child-centred approach. They work flexibly and compassionately, maintaining awareness of the individual needs and circumstances of each young person.

How Taith works: 1 Referral

Who refers? Usually a Youth Offending Team, children's social care or CAMHS.

2 Screening

Screening takes place in order to identify appropriate referrals. (The Taith team will discuss cases that are not with the person making the referral.)

3 Consultation meeting

A consultation meeting will be held for the carer and any other professionals involved in the case to gather relevant information and explore safety arrangements.

4 Introductory meeting

Parents, carers, the referrer and the Taith practitioner will attend a meeting to explain why the referral has been made and how Taith works, including the parameters around confidentiality.

5 Assessment

Time is taken to develop a trusting relationship between practitioner and child while completing a structured assessment.

6 Interventions

Practitioners work flexibly with each child to tailor interventions to suit their individual needs. Working in an empathetic, traumainformed way, they draw from a variety of evidencebased interventions to build a 'secure base' with the child. Child-led work can involve exploring traumatic memories, reflecting on behaviour and emotions and working towards change, through CBTinformed practice, alongside other approaches.

Working with others

We also offer assistance to parents, foster carers and other professionals who are supporting the CYP.
