
DEPARTMENT FOR WORK AND PENSIONS - CV WRITING

The workshop focused on helping students understand how their career choices and further education or training can influence their financial stability








ASK ASSEMBLY

Year 9 students took part in a workshop to develop essential skills such as money management, financial literacy and understanding the role of banks in the economy.


They took part in engaging activities learning about budgeting, saving and the importance of financial planning.














JD SPORT UP EVENT

PWC - LONDON OFFICE VISIT


Year 10 students who have an interest in business had the chance to explore office life and PWC operations through engaging activities at their London headquarters.
