Pentecost - Come Holy Spirit

The Society of St Joseph delivered a very prayerful and reflective assembly on the great feast of Pentecost, speaking about the Holy Spirit empowering the Apostles to go out and preach the Gospel, even to their death.

Each of the students had recently received the sacrament of confirmation; Bishop Alan had visited their parish and laid hands on them so as to confer the fullness of the Holy Spirit upon them and complete their sacramental journey which began at the baptismal font.

We heard some powerful testimonies of faith from Osasere, Amber and Lianne, who each described the build up and preparation to their confirmation day, what happened at the ceremony and how they feel the sacrament has strengthened them in faith, as well as the particular gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit that they have received.

Corpus Christi - The Body of Christ

Our school chaplains led the assembly in the week leading up to the feast of Corpus Christi, which takes place in England and Wales on Sunday 29th June.

The assembly focussed on the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist, and in particular on the message of Blessed Carlo Acutis, who had a great devotion to Eucharistic Adoration and daily reception of Holy Communion, as well as his website which has documented 107 Eucharistic Miracles which have taken place around the world.

Students watched a video detailing the transformation of the sacred host into a piece of heart tissue in 1996 in Buenos Aires, and were encouraged to ask what God might be trying to communicate to each of us through these miracles.


