



We do this by offering high-quality training opportunities for all staff which lead to great teaching and learning in the classroom for your children. We love welcoming visitors into our school to observe our lessons and to attend training, but we have also adapted all our courses to be available online.

Ultimately, pupils at All Saints get to work with staff who are enthusiastic, collaborative, and trained in best practice.

PROGRESS AND RESULTS

All Saints is not an exam factory but a welcoming communi ty that enables all pupils to grow and d evelop into successful citizens ready to face whatever challenges come their way. Our quality-first teaching approach has led to ac hievements which we are very proud of. Ou r pupils, parents and staff have seen our exam results get better and better.

Our progress 8 score for GCSE results has increased from 0.31 to 0.53 in the three years leading up to 2019. This places us in the 'well above average' category for school progress and in the top 14% of schools in the country! Our sixth form offer has increased and we are very proud that our students leave us to go to some of the best universities in the country as well as some amazing apprenticeships.

BUILT FOR BREADTH AND DEPTH OF LEARNING

Our school day is carefully structured to ensure that pupils can benefit from academic depth and creative learning techniques.

All of our pupils are given time during period three to develop their love of reading. We provide a minimum of fifteen minutes a day to 'drop everything and read'. This is known as DEAR time.

The inclusion of one-hundred-minute lessons in our school day also ensures that project-based learning, presentations, discovery learning, physical education, debates and many more activities can be given adequate time. There are also other practical benefits to our school day. Pupils benefit from intensely preparing for fewer lessons per day, having fewer transitions between lessons and being able to recall learning with greater ease.

At the end of our school day we encourage all pupils to participate in our dynamic co-curricular offer. All departments place emphasis on learning continuing outside of the classroom and therefore each department contributes to our co-curricular offer.

We will stand alongside all parents and carers to ensure that we maximise character development, faith formation and the learning experience of our pupils.


Before their learning even begins they are provided with a free breakfast to give them the energy they need throughout the day.




