Dear Parents and students,

Primary schools local to us have begun to open but as you will have seen secondary schools are not due to open to secondary school students until the 15th June and this is for small groups of year 10 students only. As a Catholic school and a community, we recognise we are all equal in God's eyes and in living out RUAH, the respect and understanding in our community, must radiate outside the walls of our school as we advocate for equality and fairness in all aspects of life.

Mr Pauro will be sending out some excellent PSCHE lessons for you to explore and develop your understanding. Please think about doing these lessons as a family if you can and discuss our collective responsibility to live RUAH and not just speak it.



First Time Baker

BLUEBERRY MUFFINS

- 8oz plain flour
- 1 tbsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 5oz caster sugar
- 3oz butter, cut into pieces
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1/4 pint milk
- 1/2 tsp vanilla essence
- 4oz blueberries
- icing sugar to dust



- 1. Preheat the oven to gas mark 6 (200C, 400F)
- 2. Sift the flour, baking powder, sugar and salt into a bowl
- 3. Rub in the butter until it resembles breadcrumbs
- 4. Stir in the milk, beaten egg and essence. Mix well.
- 5. Fold in the blueberries
- 6. Spoon into muffin cases
- 7. Bake for 20-25 minutes until golden
- 8. Cool on a wire rake and dust with icing sugar when cold.

If you don't have blueberries you can use fresh apple cut into small pieces or any frozen fruit.
