- Ask your child to download the app and use it once a week to revise line and space notes. And it is free!



Drawing challenge


You can doodle, paint, draw... spent just 10 mins or as long as you would like too!





Weekly Numeracy Challenge

View the blocks on the left from the orange point and direction of the arrow. Which image on the right is the correct view?





The correct answer is D, we call this view front elevation!





If one and half hens lay one and half eggs in one and a half days, how many eggs does one hen lay in one day?



Solution!

Find the daily rate per hen:

Hens × Days × (Daily Rate) = Eggs

11/2 × 11/2 × (Daily Rate) = 11/2

(Daily Rate) = 1½ / (1½ × 1½)

Daily Rate = 1/(11/2) = 2/3

So 1 hen in 1 day will lay two-thirds of an egg



First Time Baker

EASY SCONES

- 300g self-raising flour
- 125ml thick cream
- 125ml lemonade
- 1. Preheat the oven to 220C.
- 2. Lightly grease a baking tray.
- 3. Place the flour in a large bowl.
- 4. Add the cream and lemonade and mix to form a soft dough.
- 5. Turn out onto a lightly floured workbench and knead lightly until combined.
- 6. Press the dough with your hands to a thickness of about 2cm.
- 7. Use a 6cm round cutter to cut out 8 scones and place on a baking tray.
- 8. Bake for 10-15 minutes until lightly browned.
