Within our network we have experts and former extremists who bring their first-hand knowledge to expose the way far-right groups operate, their recruitment strategies and their ultimate goals. We train teachers, community groups, faith leaders and frontline workers to spot signs of radicalisation and develop counter-arguments to far-right ideology. We will assist you in getting at-risk individuals out of the far right.
